Indian Express in final

BANGALORE, Oct. 30.

Indian Express entered the final of the Willis Inter-media cricket tournament here today, defeating Press Club of Hyderabad by 44 runs on the St. Joseph newfields.

A brisk knock of 37 by Vijendra Rao who came late in the order, enabled Indian Express to make 161 for eight in the allotted overs. PCH began on a confident note but once Indian Express skipper Joseph Hoover effected two quick breakthroughs, it collapsed and was bundled out for 117. Joseph Hoover (three for 17) was declared the 'man of the match'.

The other semi-final, played on the same ground, in the afternoon, was curtailed by rain, and remained incomplete. When the umpires called-off play, Deccan Herald was 64 for one off eight overs in reply to The Hindu's total of 123 for seven in 30 overs. For The Hindu, which was put in to bat, opener Vijay Dev played a fighting innings of 34, while P. R. Viswanathan (24) and Raja Mahendran (23 not out) shone late in the order.
